The proficiency documents will be reviewed by the MHSA MSO Program Coordinator for competency assessment. The MSO Program Coordinator will provide any necessary feedback or suggestions for revision to ensure all documents meet the required legislative standards. Upon successful review of these documents, a certificate of MSO Safety Proficiency will be administered.

Course certificates up to a maximum of 2 must be forwarded to the MHSA MSO Program Coordinator. full credits. Applicable for a Post-Secondary equivalency may be accepted for those individuals with an OHS maximum of 2 credits Certificate, a CRSP/CRST designation or other formal health and safety education. for previously achieved Documentation must be forwarded to the MHSA MSO Program Coordinator. post-secondary H&S courses. A total of 15 credits needs to be earned overall.

## **MSA Examination**

Upon receipt of a completed application, a basic study guide will be provided by the MHSA to allow the Applicant to prepare themselves for the exam. The cost of the Exam is \$100 payable to the MHSA at the time of booking.

The MSA Examination is a closed-book exam, save for the use of an Alberta OHS Act, Regulations & Code book, and is structured based off the compulsory courses listed above. The Applicant will be given three (3) hours to write the exam and all writing materials will be provided by the MHSA. A score of 80% or greater must be achieved to earn the MSO designation or MSA certification. The MHSA MSO Program Coordinator will administer a certificate of achievement to successful candidates.

## **Upgrading**

MSA applicants that earn their Manufacturing Safety Administrator certification will have the opportunity to advance to an MSO (Manufacturing Safety Officer) under the following conditions:

- the minimum 3 years of experience in manufacturing H&S has been met,
- their training is updated to include the WCB Employer Information Seminar & Return to Work Seminar,
- they have qualified as an MHSA certified Auditor,
- they submit a letter of recommendation from their employer detailing the required information (as noted on the MSO application form).
